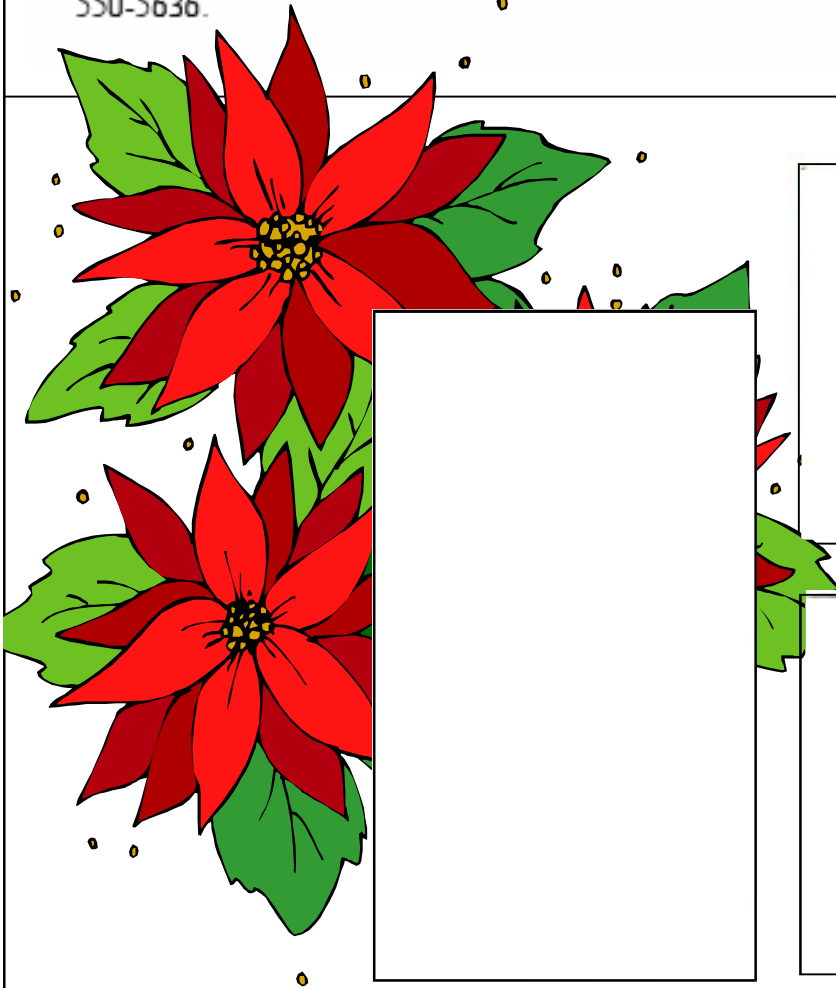

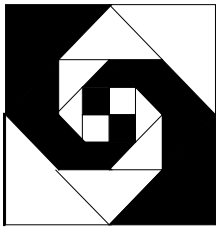

Caramel

recipe from Jill Sabol

1 cup butter
1 lb. Brown sugar
2 cups light cream (half and half)
1 cup light corn syrup
1 tsp. vanilla extract

Line an 8x8x2" pan or a 9x9x2" pan with foil, extended well over the edges. Butter the foil. In a heavy 3qt. saucepan, heat butter over low heat. Add brown sugar, cream, Karo syrup and mix well. Cook and stir over medium high heat to boiling. Clip a candy thermometer to the side of the pan. Cook and stir over medium heat to 248°, firm ball stage (45 to 60 min. or more; it took me over 2 hours). Remove candy thermometer, stir in vanilla.

Immediately pour into prepared pan. When firm, use foil to lift out of pan. Cut into squares. Wrap in plastic wrap. Makes 2 lbs.
