Clue # 2

You will start cutting your fabric and construction of the block

TWELVE BLOCK QUILT

Fabric A—cut 10 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 24 pieces 4 1/2 "
cut 24 pieces 8 1/2"

Fabric B—cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric
cut 12 pieces 4 1/2"

Background—cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 12 pieces 4 1/2

NINE BLOCK QUILT

Fabric A—cut 6 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 18 pieces 4 1/2 "
cut 18 pieces 8 1/2"

Fabric B—cut 1 strip 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric
cut 9 pieces 4 1/2"

Background—cut 1 strip 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 9 pieces 4 1/2

SIX BLOCK QUILT

Fabric A—cut 4 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 12 pieces 4 1/2 "
cut 12 pieces 8 1/2"

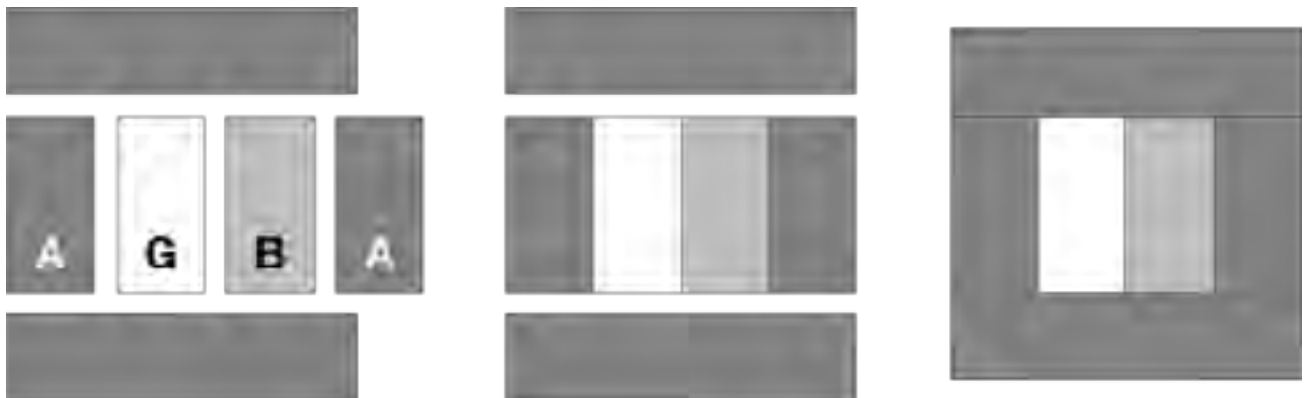
Fabric B—cut 1 strip 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric
cut 6 pieces 4 1/2"

Background—cut 1 strip 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric
cut 6 pieces 4 1/2"

****LABEL YOUR FABRIC GROUPS SO YOU WON'T GET MIXED UP!**

Sew four 4 1/2" pieces together, Fabric A, Background (G), B, and A.

Sew two 8 1/2" Fabric A pieces to the top and bottom:
